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## SELECTING THE VOTES

The Center for Legislative Accountability (CLA), an initiative of the CPAC Foundation, is the premier organization for holding lawmakers accountable. The CLA produces the longest-running conservative congressional scorecard and our state program is the only one in the nation that scores all 8,000 lawmakers in the 50 states across every policy area.

In 1971, ACUF launched its Ratings of Congress to provide a comprehensive evaluation of the voting records of every Member of Congress. The Ratings quickly became considered the “gold standard” and over the following decades have been utilized by activists, voters, academics and elected officials to determine which lawmakers best adhere to conservative principles.

In 2011, these Ratings were expanded into state legislatures as part of a five-state pilot program. By 2015, Ratings of the States grew to include all 50 states and all 99 legislative chambers. Today, the CLA annually analyzes over 105,000 pieces of legislation to issue scores for all of America’s federal and state lawmakers and presents awards to lawmakers who score 80% or better in recognition of their conservative voting records.

In order to depict how closely a lawmaker adheres to conservative principles, the CLA selects from the full spectrum of issues relating to the economy, culture, national security and government integrity. Some key areas include taxation, spending, education, labor, licensure, regulation, environment, life, free speech, Second Amendment rights, foreign aid, defense priorities and global organizations, including the United Nations. All congressional and state analyses are conducted after the adjournment of a legislative session to ensure that no issue is neglected.

To determine legislative rankings, the CLA annually evaluates over 105,000 bills that were introduced in Congress and every convening state legislature running from January 1 to December 31.

Of those bills, the CLA ultimately selects roughly 2,000 pieces of legislation that best illustrate how elected officials view the role of government in an individual’s life. The CLA calculates individual scores for a total of nearly 8,000 federal and state lawmakers based on over 157,000 votes cast on the 2,000 bills selected.

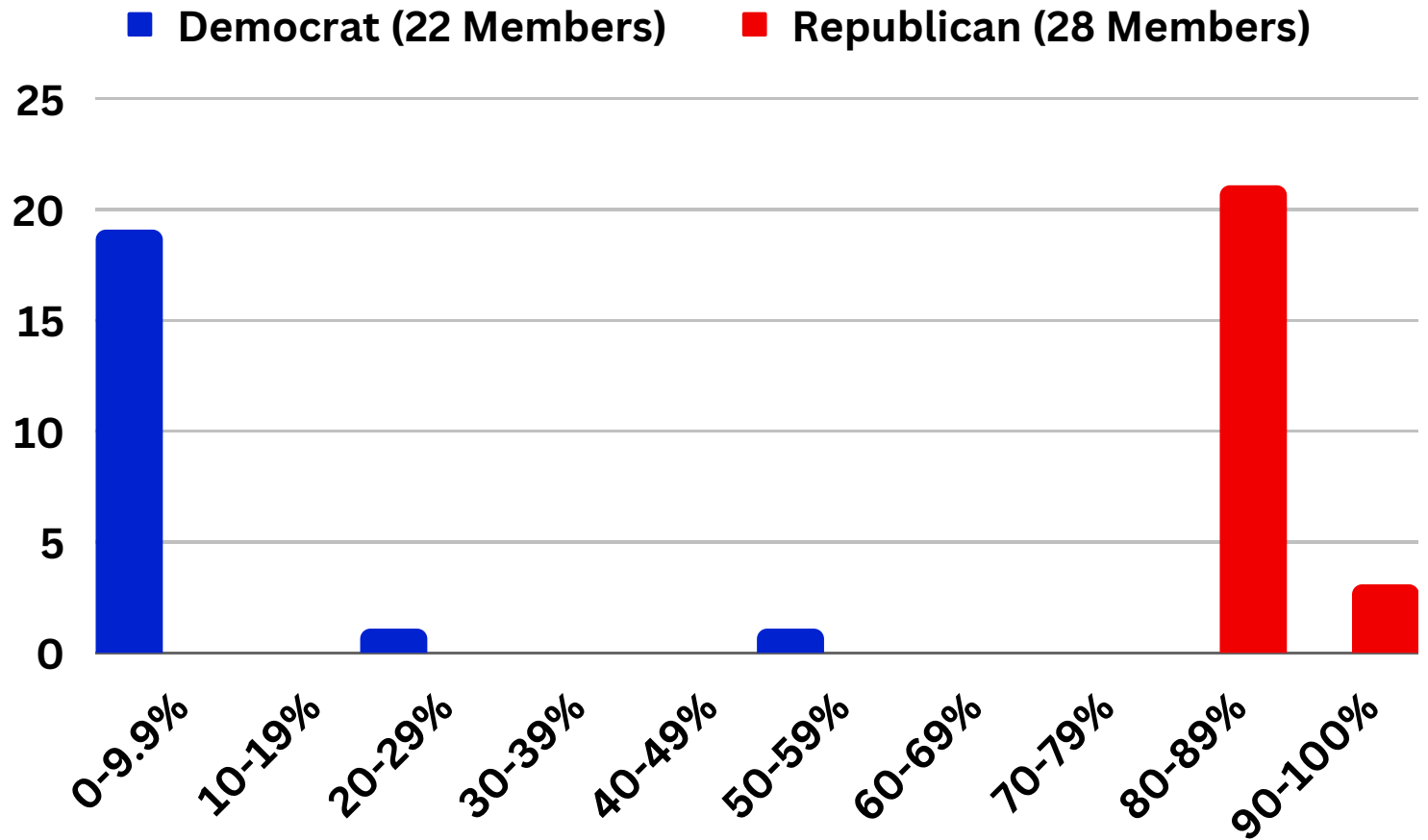

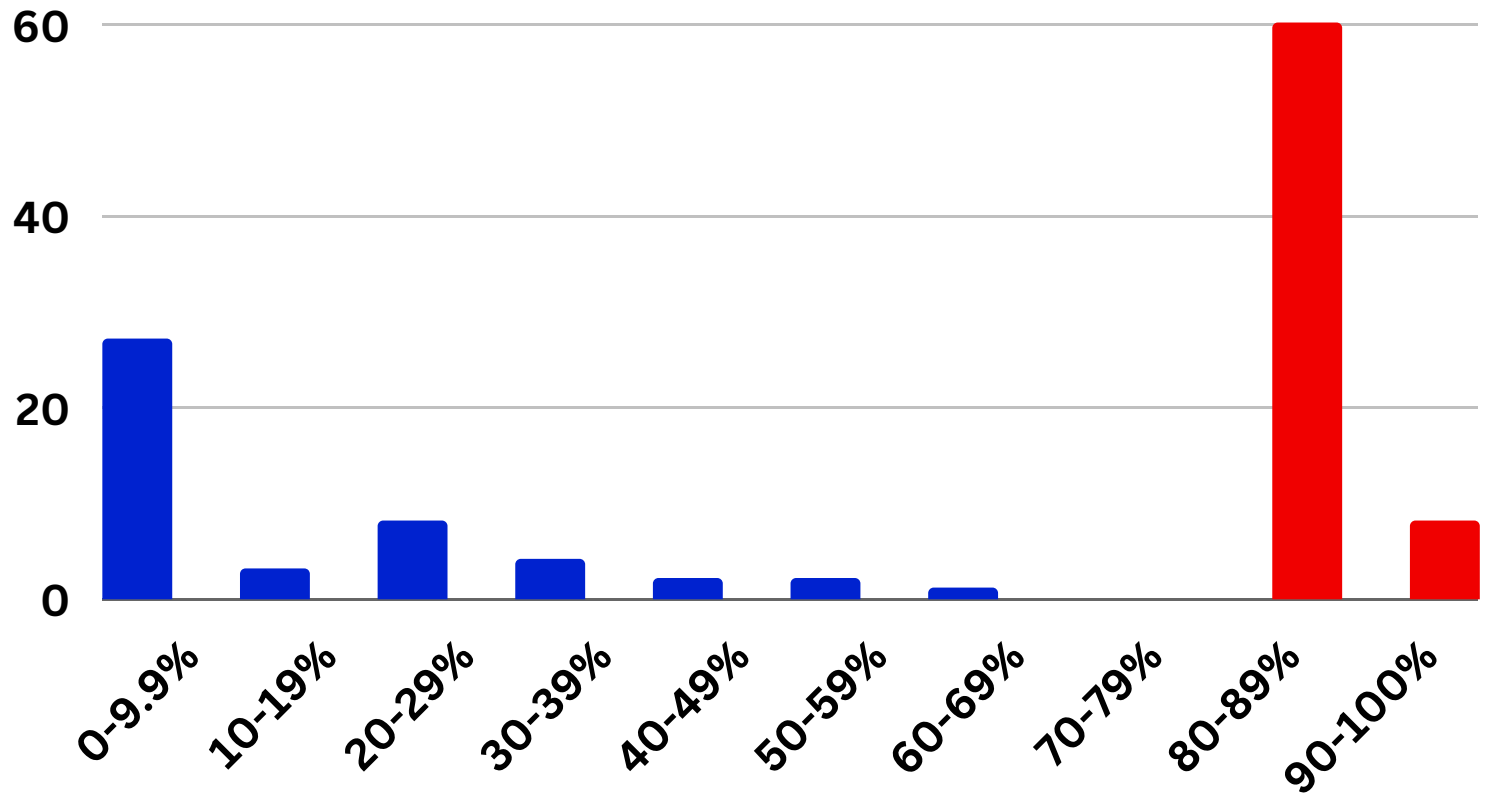

## **H 49 Making it Easier to Renew One's Concealed Carry Permit.\***

This bill waives a state regulation requiring people who desire to renew their concealed carry permit to take a safety course if they apply for a renewal within 180 days of the permit's expiration date. CPAC supports the founders' belief in the Second Amendment and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 30, 2022 by a vote of 27-20 but the bill was vetoed by the governor. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in protecting Second Amendment freedoms.

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## **H 149 Majorly Expanding Medicaid.**

This bill greatly expands the number of individuals eligible to receive Medicaid in North Carolina and makes some reforms to the state's Certificate of Need program. While CPAC believes that Certificate of Need programs are in need of reform, it greatly opposes the continued expansion of Medicaid and opposed this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 2, 2022 by a vote of 44-1 but the bill never received final approval.

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## **H 755 Establishing a Parental Bill of Rights.\***

This bill affirms the existence of certain rights that parents possess over their children. For example, it states that parents have the right to direct their child's education, to make health decisions for their child, to steer their child's moral or religious training, and to access all education-related records associated with their child. CPAC supports strengthening parental rights and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on June 1, 2022 by a vote of 28-18 but the bill never received final approval. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in promoting parental rights.

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## **S 101 Providing for the Enforcement of Immigration Laws.\***

This bill requires local law enforcement officials to cooperate with any detainer or administrative warrant issued by immigration officials. The bill also requires local officials to check the immigration status of anyone charged with certain felonies or serious misdemeanors. CPAC supports the enforcement of federal immigration laws and supported this bill. The Senate passed the bill on July 1, 2022 by a vote of 25-19 but the bill was vetoed by the governor. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in defending the Southern border.

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## **S173 Promoting Parental Rights.**

This bill gives parents the authority to decide whether their child will wear a face mask on public school property. CPAC supports strengthening parental rights in education and supported this bill. The Senate failed to override the governor's veto of the bill on March 9, 2022 by a vote of 27-22 (60% was required).

## **H 1174 Urging Congress to Oppose the SEC's Radical Climate Agenda.\***

This resolution encourages Congress to oppose a new requirement from the SEC that forces companies to disclose their Scope 3 greenhouse gas emissions. CPAC recognizes that this effort by the SEC represents an attempt to cram down ESG principles on the private sector and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on June 22, 2022 by a vote of 78-31. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in opposing radical Leftist ideas about the climate.

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## **H 1046 Expanding the Aviation Sales Tax Exemption.**

This bill broadens the sales tax carve-out for airplane parts and accessories used in the repair or maintenance of aircraft. CPAC does not support exempting government-favored products from taxes and opposed this bill. The House passed the bill on June 8, 2022 by a vote of 96-5 but the bill was not taken up by the Senate.

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## **S 101 Providing for the Enforcement of Immigration Laws.\***

This bill requires local law enforcement officials to cooperate with any detainer or administrative warrant issued by immigration officials. The bill also requires local officials to check the immigration status of anyone charged with certain felonies or serious misdemeanors. CPAC supports the enforcement of federal immigration laws and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on June 30, 2022 by a vote of 65-47 but the bill was vetoed by the governor. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in defending the Southern border.

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## **S173 Promoting Parental Rights.\***

This bill gives parents the authority to decide whether their child will wear a face mask on public school property. CPAC supports strengthening parental rights and supported this bill. The House passed the bill on February 17, 2022 by a vote of 76-42 but the bill was vetoed by the governor. \*This bill was double-weighted because of its importance in promoting parental rights.

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## **S 762 (Amd. A2) Increasing Bureaucratic Burdens on Farmers.**

The Meyer (CPAC Lifetime Rating 24%) amendment to S 762 adds a provision to the bill requiring that certain farm buildings receive yearly fire inspections from the city or county. CPAC believes that this unnecessarily increases burdens on farmers and opposed this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on June 28, 2022 by a vote of 41-71.
