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LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN



The CPAC Foundation is proud to present the 53rd edition of CPAC's Ratings of Congress. We are proud to carry on the responsibility of holding our representatives in Washington D.C. accountable to the American public. I especially would like to thank our ratings team including our longtime veteran Larry Hart, Coleman Martinis, and our Director of Policy and Advocacy Thomas Bradbury for their work carrying on this tradition.

Although the outcome of the mid-term election was not all we might have wanted, it did produce a narrow Republican majority in the House. Freed from Speaker Nancy Pelosi, conservatives finally received the chance to promote and vote on a wide array of amendments. The incredible diversity of issues touched on by these amendments has helped differentiate establishment Republicanism from the true constitutional conservatives more than ever. To accommodate this phenomenon, we have greatly expanded the number of votes we have chosen to use in the ratings this year.

Despite the presence of more opportunities to vote on key issues and their majority in the House, Republicans generally failed to have any major positive effect on the overall state of affairs in Congress. Much of the year was wasted on Continuing Resolutions that kept in place Nancy Pelosi's exorbitant spending policies and failed Congressional Review Act resolutions that let the corrupt bureaucracy in the executive branch maintain its abusive authority.

Now, America finds itself yet again at a crossroads both at home and abroad. I encourage readers to use this guide to educate themselves about the issues that are sure to spring up again this year.

SELECTING THE VOTES

The Center for Legislative Accountability (CLA), an initiative of the CPAC Foundation, is the premier organization for holding lawmakers accountable. The CLA produces the longest-running conservative congressional scorecard and our state program is the only one in the nation that scores all 8,000 lawmakers in the 50 states across every policy area.

In 1971, ACUF launched its Ratings of Congress to provide a comprehensive evaluation of the voting records of every Member of Congress. The Ratings quickly became considered the "gold standard" and over the following decades have been utilized by activists, voters, academics and elected officials to determine which lawmakers best adhere to conservative principles.

In 2011, these Ratings were expanded into state legislatures as part of a five-state pilot program. By 2015, Ratings of the States grew to include all 50 states and all 99 legislative chambers. Today, the CLA annually analyzes over 105,000 pieces of legislation to issue scores for all of America's federal and state lawmakers and presents awards to lawmakers who score 80% or better in recognition of their conservative voting records.

In order to depict how closely a lawmaker adheres to conservative principles, the CLA selects from the full spectrum of issues relating to the economy, culture, national security and government integrity. Some key areas include taxation, spending, education, labor, licensure, regulation, environment, life, free speech, Second Amendment rights, foreign aid, defense priorities and global organizations, including the United Nations. All congressional and state analyses are conducted after the adjournment of a legislative session to ensure that no issue is neglected.

To determine legislative rankings, the CLA annually evaluates over 105,000 bills that were introduced in Congress and every convening state legislature running from January 1 to December 31.

Of those bills, the CLA ultimately selects roughly 2,000 pieces of legislation that best illustrate how elected officials view the role of government in an individual's life. The CLA calculates individual scores for a total of nearly 8,000 federal and state lawmakers based on over 157,000 votes cast on the 2,000 bills selected.





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U.S. SENATE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

(Roll Call 1) PN 138 Confirmation of Brendan Owens to the Position of Assistant Secretary of Defense.

This roll call vote was taken in order to confirm Brendan Owens as the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Energy, Installations, and Environment. Owens is the DoD's Chief Sustainability Officer and was previously a principal at Black Vest Strategies, a consulting firm centered on "...the intersection of health, equity, and climate issues in the built environment." He also helped found Ecountable, Inc. to "democratize" access to ESG scores. CPAC believes that the Department of Defense should focus on promoting the US' national security interests and not on the promotion of DEI or ESG scores. CPAC opposed this confirmation. The Senate confirmed Brendan Owens on January 23, 2023 by a vote of 60–35.

(Roll Call 35) H.J.Res. 30 Protecting Pension Funds from the ESG Regime.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Andy Barr (CPAC Lifetime Rating 79%) nullifies the Department of Labor rule titled, "Prudence and Loyalty in Selecting Plan Investments and Exercising Shareholder Rights." This rule allows public investment managers to invest pension funds based on ESG standards and objectives. CPAC believes that financial managers should make decisions based on the financial interests of those they represent rather than arbitrary and irrelevant woke goals. CPAC, therefore, supported this resolution. The Senate passed this resolution on March 1, 2023 by a vote of 50-46 but President Biden vetoed the resolution.

(Roll Call 67) S. 316 (Lee Amd.) Requiring Congress to Re-Authorize the Use of Military Force Every Two Years.

The Sen. Mike Lee (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to S. 316 requires that any law that is passed authorizing the use of military force be terminated after two years unless re-authorized by Congress. CPAC supports efforts to improve Congressional oversight over the US' defense initiatives and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on March 23, 2023 by a vote of 19-76.

(Roll Call 71) S. 316 (Johnson Amd.) Protecting the US from Infringements on its National Sovereignty by Globalist Organizations.

The Sen. Ron Johnson (CPAC Lifetime Rating 91%) amendment to S. 316 requires that any agreements on pandemic response and preparedness reached by the WHO be subject to Senate ratification prior to taking effect in the United States. In 2024, the board of CPAC alongside leaders from around the globe passed a resolution "...[condemning] the attempts of the World Health Organization, in coordination with the Biden Administration, the Chinese Communist Party, and the Gates Foundation, to surrender national sovereignty to a de-facto global government through a radically revised public health 'treaty." CPAC, therefore, supports efforts to reduce the infringements of the WHO on the US' national sovereignty and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on March 28, 2023 by a vote of 47-49.



(Roll Call 75) S. 316 (Scott Amd.) Commencing an Investigation into President Biden's Disastrous Withdrawal from Afghanistan.

The Sen. Rick Scott (CPAC Lifetime Rating 90%) amendment to S. 316 establishes a Joint Committee on Afghanistan tasked with the job of investigating President Biden's withdrawal of US forces from Afghanistan. CPAC recognizes that the withdrawal from Afghanistan was a major embarrassment for the US and a foreign policy disaster that must be scrutinized. CPAC, therefore, supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on March 28, 2023 by a vote of 33-62.

(Roll Call 79) H.J.Res. 27 Disapproving the Biden Administration's Onerous New Definition of WOTUS.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Sam Graves (CPAC Lifetime Rating 83%) nullifies the Biden administration's new definition of "waters of the US." Had the executive branch been left to its own devices, the new definition would have overruled the old 2020 definition by expanding it to include certain wetlands and ephemeral waters. This measure, in turn, would have greatly increased the regulatory power of the EPA and associated entities. CPAC opposes any increase in the regulatory powers of the EPA, opposes major increases in regulatory burdens on American citizens, and supported this resolution. The Senate passed this resolution on March 29, 2023 by a vote of 53-43.

(Roll Call 84) PN 5 Confirmation of Radha lyengar Plumb to the Position of Deputy Under Secretary of Defense.

This roll call vote was taken to confirm Radha Iyengar Plumb as the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition and Sustainment. Iyengar Plumb previously served as Director of Research and Insights for Trust & Safety at Google and as the Global Head of Policy Analysis at Facebook. Iyengar Plumb held both positions while the companies censored information not deemed acceptable by the radical Left. She is also one of the co-authors of a paper titled, "Assessing the Implications of Allowing Transgender Personnel to Serve Openly," in which the authors argue that the Department of Defense should integrate openly serving transgender people into the armed forces, adopt anti-harassment policies for transgender service members, and create gender advisers that can give out advice on gender transition-related issues. CPAC believes that the Department of Defense should focus on promoting the US' national security interests and not on the promotion of radical gender ideology or censorship of speech. CPAC opposed this confirmation. The Senate confirmed Radha Iyengar Plumb on April 18, 2023 by a vote of 68-30.

(Roll Call 90) S.J.Res. 10 Fewer Taxpayer Dollars for Abortionists.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. Tommy Tuberville (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) nullifies an interim rule created by the Department of Veteran Affairs titled, "Reproductive Health Services." The rule allows the Department to provide abortion services to veterans. CPAC believes abortion is always a human tragedy, opposes its expansion, and supported this resolution. The Senate defeated this resolution on April 19, 2023 by a vote of 48–51.



(Roll Call 99) S.J.Res. 4 Resurrecting the Long-Dead Equal Rights Amendment.

This resolution sponsored by Sen. Benjamin Cardin (CPAC Lifetime Rating 4%) attempts to ratify the Left's Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the U.S. Constitution by eliminating the 1979 ratification deadline. CPAC recognizes that the ERA is a Leftist weapon that activist judges would use to bludgeon conservative entities throughout the United States. CPAC therefore opposes its revival and opposed this resolution. The Senate voted for cloture on this resolution on April 27, 2023 by a vote of 51-47 but the resolution did not progress any further.

(Roll Call 126) H.J.Res. 42 Ending Washington D.C.'s Anti-Police, Pro-Crime Policies.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Andrew Clyde (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) nullifies Washington D.C.'s Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Act Amendment of 2022. This legislation siphoned off funds for police operations to pay for DEI programs and placed unnecessary restrictions on law enforcement. CPAC has long worked to make our communities safer and to improve the work of the police in achieving this end. CPAC recognizes that DC's reform will have the opposite effect and, therefore, supported this resolution. The Senate passed this resolution on May 16, 2023 by a vote of 56-43 but the House failed to override President Biden's veto of this resolution.

(Roll Call 130) S.J.Res. 18 Nullifying Bureaucratic Rules that Facilitate Illegal Immigration.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) nullifies a 2022 rule issued by the Department of Homeland Security titled, "Public Charge Ground of Inadmissibility." This Biden admin rule overruled a Trump admin rule that made it more difficult for the US to admit a foreign migrant into the US if it was found that the migrant would be likely to depend on the US welfare system. CPAC opposes the expansion of the welfare state, opposes measures that incentivize illegal immigration into the US, and supported this resolution. The Senate defeated this resolution on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 47-50.

(Roll Call 132) PN 95 Confirmation of Nancy Abudu to Be a United States Circuit Court Judge.

This roll call vote was taken to confirm Nancy Abudu as a judge for the Eleventh United States Circuit Court. Before her appointment, she worked as a staff attorney on the ACLU Voting Rights Project and as a director at the Southern Poverty Law Center (SPLC). While she was employed at the SPLC, the organization accused Republican members of the Senate Judiciary Committee of being "white supremacists." CPAC recognizes that this extensive Leftist advocacy work prevents Nancy Abudu from administering justice impartially and opposed this confirmation. The Senate confirmed Nancy Abudu on May 18, 2023 by a vote of 49-47.



(Roll Call 135) H.J.Res. 45 Cracking on Down Unconstitutional Executive Student Loan Actions.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Bob Good (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) nullifies a rule promulgated by the Department of Education titled, "One Time Federal Student Loan Debt Relief." This rule forgave \$10,000 of student debt. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay off other people's student debts, believes that this action was clearly unconstitutional, and supported this resolution. The Senate passed this resolution on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 52-46 but President Biden vetoed the resolution.

(Roll Call 136) H.R. 3746 (Paul Amd.) Requiring the Filing of a Report on the Expenditures of the Federal Government.

The Sen. Rand Paul (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 requires the Office of Management and Budget to annually prepare a report discussing whether outlays for the previous fiscal year were greater than the outlay limit for that year. The amendment then requires the President to issue a sequestration order reducing discretionary spending if outlays are found to be greater than the limit. CPAC supports efforts to impose fiscal restraints on the federal government and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 21-75.

(Roll Call 137) H.R. 3746 (Braun Amd.) Forcing Deficit Reductions During Debt Crises.

The Sen. Mike Braun (CPAC Lifetime Rating 94%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 permanently diminishes the discretionary appropriations account by 1% every 30 days during debt ceiling crisis periods. CPAC supports measures that impose fiscal responsibility on Congress and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 35-62.

(Roll Call 138) H.R. 3746 (Marshall Amd.) Mitigating President Biden's Border Crisis.

The Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 requires the immediate resumption of construction on the border wall and expands the means officials may use to prevent illegal immigrants from entering the country. CPAC supports the enforcement of federal immigration laws and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 46-51.

(Roll Call 141) H.R. 3746 (Kennedy Amd.) Preserving Work Requirements within the US' Welfare System.

The Sen. John Kennedy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 removes the 2030 sunset date on certain modifications that the bill makes to work requirement exemptions for the US' SNAP programs. These modifications gradually raise the upper age limit at which individuals are subject to the able-bodied adults without dependents limit to 55. CPAC supports efforts to ensure that the welfare system remains a temporary bridge between jobs and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 46-51.



(Roll Call 143) H.R. 3746 (Budd Amd.) Rescinding the Apportionment of Unused COVID Funds.

The Sen. Ted Budd (CPAC Lifetime Rating 78%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 rescinds the apportionment of any remaining funds appropriated in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and other associated laws. CPAC believes that unused funds appropriated to mitigate the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic should be rescinded and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 47–52.

(Roll Call 144) H.R. 3746 (Lee Amd.) Amendment Requiring Balanced Government Spending.

The Sen. Mike Lee (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 removes the ability of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget to waive PAYGO requirements when attempting to deliver "essential services." The PAYGO system (short for "pay as you go") requires that mandatory spending increases and tax cuts be mitigated by the raising of taxes or cuts to spending. CPAC supports efforts to force the federal government to become more fiscally responsible and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on June 1, 2023 by a vote of 48-51.

(Roll Call 167) S.J.Res. 11 Protecting Consumers Against the EPA's Attempts to Crack Down on Gas-Powered Vehicles.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. Deb Fischer (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) nullifies a rule issued by the EPA titled, "Control of Air Pollution from New Motor Vehicles: Heavy-Duty Engine and Vehicle Standards." The rule sets stringent emissions standards for heavy-duty vehicles manufactured in 2027 and in the years after. CPAC opposes the promotion of the Left's radical climate agenda through the imposition of costly regulations and supported this resolution. The Senate sustained President Biden's veto of this resolution on June 21, 2023 by a vote of 50-50.

(Roll Call 171) H.J.Res. 44 Nullifying the ATF's Absurd Shoulder Brace Rule.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Andrew Clyde (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) nullifies a rule submitted by the ATF titled, "Factoring Criteria for Firearms with Attached 'Stabilizing Braces'." This rule attempts to classify firearms with stabilizing braces as "rifles," a measure that would subject them to far stricter regulation and place millions of Americans in danger of automatically becoming felons. CPAC opposes the ATF's infringement on the Second Amendment, supports efforts to uphold Second Amendment freedoms, and supported this resolution. The Senate defeated this resolution on June 22, 2023 by a vote of 49-50.



(Roll Call 191) S. 2226 (Paul Amd.) Preserving Congress' Authority to Declare War.

The Sen. Rand Paul (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 clarifies that Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty does not overrule the requirement that Congress declare war before the US goes to war. CPAC supports efforts to properly define the nature of the assistance that the US will give its allies if Article 5 of the North Atlantic Treaty is triggered and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 19, 2023 by a vote of 16-83.

(Roll Call 192) S. 2226 (Hawley Amd.) Ending the Pentagon's Multi-Billion Dollar Accounting Errors.

The Sen. Josh Hawley (CPAC Lifetime Rating 85%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 clarifies the meaning of "aggregated value" in certain portions of public law to better reflect the full cost of sending military aid to foreign entities. CPAC supports exactness in the tabulation of the cost of providing assistance to other nations, supports government transparency, and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 19, 2023 by a vote of 39-60.

(Roll Call 195) S. 2226 (Lee Amd.) Adding Advantageous Conditions to the Continued Funding of Ukraine.

The Sen. Mike Lee (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 prohibits the government from expending more than 2 percent of the funds apportioned to Ukraine in this act until the members of NATO meet their financial obligations to the organization. CPAC believes that President Donald Trump's strategy of conditioning increases in funding for the US' European allies on the choice of other countries to contribute their fair share to the cause at hand is an acceptable strategy moving forward. Additionally, 82% of the respondents to CPAC's 2024 straw poll disapproved of measures that provide an even greater amount of funds to Ukraine. CPAC, therefore, supported this amendment as a way of driving nations to contribute more to Ukraine's war against Russian aggression and as a means of cracking down on wanton spending in the nation. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 20, 2023 by a vote of 13-71.

(Roll Call 199) S. 2226 (Cruz Amd.) Providing Restitution for Injustices Committed Against Members of the Armed Forces.

The Sen. Ted Cruz (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 provides remedies to former members of the armed forces who were removed from the military for their refusal to obey the COVID-19 vaccine mandate. It changes their records such that they read that they were "honorably discharged" and allows such members to be reinstated at the highest grade in which they were employed before their involuntary separation. CPAC supports efforts to reverse the negative consequences occasioned by the military's masochistic vaccine mandates and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 26, 2023 by a vote of 46-53.



(Roll Call 201) S. 2226 (Paul Amd.) Increasing Oversight of Ukraine Aid.

The Sen. Rand Paul (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 expands the Office of the Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction such that it may perform oversight functions over Ukraine aid. CPAC recognizes that, so far, over \$40,000,000 has been identified as having been embezzled by Ukrainian officials. CPAC therefore supports efforts to audit the funds sent to Ukraine by the US and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 26, 2023 by a vote of 20-78.

(Roll Call 204) S. 2226 (Marshall Amd.) Requiring Patriotic Flags to Be Flown at Federal Facilities.

The Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 states that only the American flag, state flags, military service flags, and a selection of other flags may be flown at federal facilities. CPAC supports efforts to promote patriotism in the federal government and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 27, 2023 by a vote of 50-49 (a 3/5 vote was needed for the amendment to pass).

(Roll Call 205) S. 2226 (Kennedy Amd.) Undermining Countries that Actively Support Terrorist Organizations.

The Sen. John Kennedy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 prohibits the President from voting to allocate Special Drawing Rights at the International Monetary Fund to countries that sponsor terrorist organizations or commit genocide. CPAC supports efforts to cut the purse strings of state sponsors of terrorism and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on July 27, 2023 by a vote of 51-47 (a 3/5 vote was needed for the amendment to pass).

(Roll Call 209) S. 2226 (Schatz Amd.) Reauthorizing Portions of an Unconstitutional Act that Further Involves the US in the Housing Market.

The Sen. Brian Schatz (CPAC Lifetime Rating 3%) amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2024 reauthorizes portions of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act. The first few sections of the NAHASDA create a grant program that can be used by Native Americans in order to obtain housing assistance. The last title of the NAHASDA authorizes the Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grant Program. This program, the likes of which excludes non-indigenous Hawaiians from its benefits, assists Native Hawaiians with finding and procuring affordable housing. In doing so, it violates the Equal Protection Clause of the US Constitution. CPAC opposes this breach of constitutionality and opposed this amendment.



(Roll Call 242) S.J.Res. 9 Further Expanding the Government's Abuse of the Endangered Species List.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) nullifies a rule created by the US Fish and Wildlife Service titled, "Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants; Lesser Prairie-Chicken; Threatened Status with Section 4(d) Rule for the Northern Distinct Population Segment and Endangered Status for the Southern Distinct Population Status." The rule places the Lesser Prairie-Chicken on the endangered species list and extends various protections to it. CPAC recognizes that the endangered species list has been used by Left-wing environmental radicals to stop economic development. In the case of the Lesser Prairie-Chicken, its "endangerment" has helped bolster opposition to the Keystone XL pipeline, a project particularly hated by the environmental Left. CPAC opposes the abuse of the endangered species list in this way and supported this resolution. The Senate sustained President Biden's veto of this resolution on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 47-46.

(Roll Call 247) H.R. 5860 Temporarily Extending Pelosi's Unsustainable Spending Policies.

This continuing resolution sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Continuing Appropriations Act, 2024 and Other Extensions Act," allowed the government to continue spending money at its then-current levels for 45 days. CPAC opposes these extensions and the preservation of irresponsible spending policies and opposed this bill. The Senate passed this bill on September 30, 2023 by a vote of 88-9 and the bill later became law.

(Roll Call 260) S.J.Res. 32 Cracking Down on Leftist Weapons Against Meritocracy and Business.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. John Kennedy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) nullifies a rule created by the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau titled, "Small Business Lending Under the Equal Credit Opportunity Act (Regulation B)." The rule makes it easier for the CFPB to receive information on the demographics of businesses that submit applications for credit to covered financial institutions. CPAC recognizes that this information is used to promote the Left's equity agenda, opposes the racist and sexist means employed by the Left to reach the goals of this agenda, and supported this resolution. The Senate passed this resolution on October 18, 2023 by a vote of 53-44.

(Roll Call 267) H.R. 4366 (Rubio Amd.) Countering Onerous Housing Energy Efficiency Standards.

The Sen. Marco Rubio (CPAC Lifetime Rating 88%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the Department of Housing and Urban Development from using public funds to update minimum efficiency standards for housing developments that it sponsors. CPAC recognizes that an update of this nature would raise the cost of such housing, opposes this consequence, and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on October 25, 2023 by a vote of 47-51.



(Roll Call 272) S.J.Res. 42 Prohibiting the Biden Administration from Starving School Children in Order to Promote the Trans Agenda.

This resolution sponsored by Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) nullifies a rule put forward by the Food and Drug Administration titled, "Application of Bostock v. Clayton County to Program Discrimination Complaint Processing-Policy Update." The rule allows adjunct agencies of the FDA to consider discrimination based on gender and sexual orientation to be a violation of public policy. In doing so, it would permit the FDA to cut school lunch funding for schools that don't allow men to enter women's intimate spaces. CPAC opposes this horrific abuse of funding authority and supported this resolution. The Senate defeated this resolution on October 26, 2023 by a vote of 47-50.

(Roll Call 279) H.R. 4366 (Budd Amd.) Stopping the Federal Government's Usurpation of the Electoral Process.

The Sen. Ted Budd (CPAC Lifetime Rating 78%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits funds appropriated in the bill from being used to implement Executive Order 14019. This Order directs the heads of executive agencies to develop plans to register people to vote while performing their various duties and responsibilities. CPAC opposes measures that decrease election security and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on October 31, 2023 by a vote of 45–50:

(Roll Call 280) H.R. 4366 (Paul Amd.) Calling for an Audit of the Fed.

The Sen. Rand Paul (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 requires the Comptroller General of the US to conduct an audit of the Federal Reserve Board of Governors and the Federal Reserve banks. CPAC supports efforts to hold the Fed accountable for its impact on the American dollar and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on November 1, 2023 by a vote of 46-51.

(Roll Call 281) H.R. 4366 (Paul Amd.) Reducing Spending During a Budget Impasse.

The Sen. Rand Paul (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 cuts funding for programs and bureaucracies funded by the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act and the Transportation, Housing and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act. CPAC supports efforts to reduce bureaucratic bloat and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on November 1, 2023 by a vote of 23-74.

(Roll Call 283) H.R. 4366 (Lee Amd.) Turning Congress into a Watchdog Against Bureaucratic Malfeasance.

The Sen. Mike Lee (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 requires federal agencies to, when creating a new rule, publish in the federal registry a list of the information upon which the rule is based. It then requires the agency to submit the rule to Congress such that legislators may approve the rule. CPAC supports efforts to crack down on burdensome and unnecessary regulations and supported this amendment. The Senate defeated this amendment on November 1, 2023 by a vote of 46-51.



(Roll Call 309) H.R. 6126 Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act," appropriates funds to Israel for its Iron Dome system and other defense measures. It then offsets the cost of this appropriation by reducing funds that were eventually to be appropriated to the Internal Revenue Service. CPAC supports Israel's right to defend itself, supports the lowering of funds appropriated to the IRS, and supported this bill. The Senate killed this bill on November 14, 2023 by a vote of 51-48.

(Roll Call 312) H.R. 6363 Further Extending Pelosi's Unsustainable Spending Policies.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Further Continuing Appropriations and Other Extensions Act, 2024," allowed the government to continue spending money at its then-current levels for 45 days. CPAC opposes these extensions and the preservation of irresponsible spending policies and opposed this bill. The Senate passed this bill on November 15, 2023 by a vote of 87-11 and the bill later became law.

(Roll Call 343) H.R. 2670 National Defense Authorization Act.

The NDAA for FY 2024 sponsored by Rep. Mike Rogers (CPAC Lifetime Rating 78%) is a gargantuan 3,000+ page piece of legislation that advances various Leftist causes under the guise of national security. Firstly, it extends Section 702 of the FISA Act, the likes of which allows the government to spy on Americans. Additionally, the bill continues to allow the government to fund travel for abortion purposes. CPAC believes that the Senate should instead be working to curb the growth of domestic surveillance initiatives that have been frequently abused by the government, opposes the public funding of abortion travel, and opposed the passage of this bill. The Senate passed this bill on December 13, 2023 by a vote of 87-13.

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U.S. HOUSE VOTE DESCRIPTIONS

(Roll Call 27) H.Res. 12 Creating a Select Subcommittee to Combat the Weaponization of the Federal Government.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Jim Jordan (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) creates a select subcommittee on the weaponization of the federal government. The subcommittee is tasked with investigating how the executive branch has worked with private sector and non-profit entities to take action against American citizens. CPAC has grave concerns about the government targeting its citizens and supported the creation of this committee. The House passed this resolution on January 10, 2023 by a vote of 221-211.

(Roll Call 29) H.R. 26 Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Ann Wagner (CPAC Lifetime Rating 78%), known as the "Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Act," requires healthcare practitioners to provide the same standard of care that they would administer to a baby born normally to babies that are born alive in the wake of an abortion. It additionally requires medical practitioners to take such babies to an actual hospital. CPAC believes abortion is always a human tragedy, believes that infanticide is evil, and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on January 11, 2023 by a vote of 220–210 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 30) H.Con.Res. 3 Opposing the Recent Attacks on Pro-Life Facilities.

This concurrent resolution sponsored by Rep. Mike Johnson (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) decries the vandalization of pro-life centers and houses of worship. It then calls upon the Biden administration to prioritize investigating and prosecuting these criminal acts. CPAC believes that the government should protect law-abiding citizens and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on January 11, 2023 by a vote of 222-209.

(Roll Call 31) H.R. 22 Prohibiting the Sale of Products in the Strategic Petroleum Reserve to China.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers (CPAC Lifetime Rating 84%) prohibits the Secretary of Energy from selling petroleum products from the strategic petroleum reserve to China. CPAC supports measures that hinder Communist China's progress as a dangerous force in the world and supported H. R. 22. The House passed this resolution on January 12, 2023 by a vote of 331-97.

(Roll Call 69) H.R. 21 (Ocasio-Cortez Amd.) Sacrificing the US' Energy Needs at the Altar of the Paris Accords.

The Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (CPAC Lifetime Rating 3%) amendment to the Strategic Production Response Act would limit the US' plan to expand oil and gas leasing permits by disallowing new leasing in locations where doing so would be inconsistent with the goals of the Paris Climate Accords. The Paris Climate Accords is an international treaty on climate change that the US first entered into during the Obama administration. CPAC opposes any effort to outsource policymaking to global interests and foreign bureaucrats and opposed this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on January 27, 2023 by a vote of 199-229.



(Roll Call 100) H.R. 382 Immediately Terminating the Public Health Emergency Declared Over the COVID-19 Pandemic.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Brett Guthrie (CPAC Lifetime Rating 80%), known as the "Pandemic is Over Act," officially ends the COVID-19 public health emergency declared on January 31, 2020. CPAC believes that the end of this emergency should have been declared a long time ago and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on January 31, 2023 by a vote of 220-210 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 107) H.R. 302 Forcing Taxpayers to Fund Graduate Students Studying Cybersecurity.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Deborah Ross (CPAC Lifetime Rating 5%), known as the "Energy Cybersecurity University Leadership Act," directs the Department of Energy to offer financial assistance to graduate students who are studying cybersecurity. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to fund other people's education and opposed this bill. The House passed this bill on February 6, 2023 by a vote of 357-56 but the bill never became law.

(Roll Call 116) H.R. 185 Removing the CDC's Vaccine Mandate for Foreign Travellers.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Thomas Massie (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) annuls the CDC's "Amended Order Implementing Proclamation on Advancing the Safe Resumption of Global Travel During the COVID-19 Pandemic." This order restricted noncitizen nonimmigrants from entering the United States if they were not fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The bill also prohibits the CDC from creating future orders that impose similar requirements. CPAC opposes vaccine mandates, believes that the decision to receive a vaccine should be made on a voluntary basis, and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on February 8, 2023 by a vote of 227-201 but the bill failed to advance in the Senate.

(Roll Call 118) H.J.Res. 24 Overruling Washington D.C.'s Decision to Let Noncitizens Vote.

This joint resolution sponsored by Rep. James Comer (CPAC Lifetime Rating 86%) nullifies Washington D.C.'s Local Resident Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2022. The measure allowed people who were not citizens of the US to vote in local elections. CPAC opposes measures that encourage election fraud, believes that only citizens should be permitted to vote, and supported this resolution. The House passed this joint resolution on February 9, 2023 by a vote of 260-162 but the resolution stalled in the Senate.

(Roll Call 130) H. R. 347 (Roy Amd.) Permitting Congressional Scrutiny of All Potentially Inflationary Executive Orders.

The Rep. Chip Roy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) amendment to the REININ Act makes it easier for those performing oversight functions to scrutinize potentially inflationary executive orders. It does this by removing certain types of executive orders from the list of presidential actions that could be exempted from Congressional scrutiny. CPAC supports efforts to protect Americans against arbitrary and overreaching executive orders and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on March 1, 2023 by a vote of 199-226.



(Roll Call 138) H.R. 140 Impeding the Government's Efforts to Censor Medical, Religious, and Political Speech.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the "Protecting Speech from Government Interference" Act prohibits certain federal bureaucrats from censoring people while acting in an official capacity. CPAC opposes government censorship and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on March 8, 2023 by a vote of 207-223.

(Roll Call 142) H.J.Res. 42 Disapproving the Biden Administration's Onerous New Definition of WOTUS

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Sam Graves (CPAC Lifetime Rating 83%) nullifies the Biden administration's new definition of "waters of the US." Had the executive branch been left to its own devices, the new definition would have overruled the old 2020 definition by expanding it to include certain wetlands and ephemeral waters. This measure, in turn, would have greatly increased the regulatory power of the EPA and associated entities. CPAC opposes any increase in the regulatory powers of the EPA, opposes major increases in regulatory burdens on American citizens, and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on March 9, 2023 by a vote of 227-198 but President Biden vetoed the resolution.

(Roll Call 149) H.J.Res. 30 Protecting Pension Funds from the ESG Regime.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Andy Barr (CPAC Lifetime Rating 79%) nullifies the Department of Labor rule titled, "Prudence and Loyalty in Selecting Plan Investments and Exercising Shareholder Rights." This rule allowed public investment managers to invest pension funds based on ESG standards and objectives. CPAC believes that financial managers should make decisions based on the financial interests of investors rather than arbitrary and irrelevant woke goals. CPAC, therefore, supported this resolution. The House sustained President Biden's veto of this resolution on March 23, 2023 by a vote of 219-200 (a 2/3 vote was needed to override the veto).

(Roll Call 156) H.R. 5 Terminating the Corrupt Department of Education

The Rep. Thomas Massie (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) amendment to the Parents Bill of Rights Act declares that it is the sense of Congress that the Department of Education be terminated before the end of 2023. CPAC believes that questions about public education should be decided on a state and local level and that the federal government should stop interfering in this matter. CPAC, therefore, supports the termination of the Department of Education and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on March 24, 2023 by a vote of 161-265.



(Roll Call 158) H.R. 5 (Roy Amd.) Promoting School Choice by Allowing Education Funds to Follow the Students.

The Rep. Chip Roy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) amendment to the Parents Bill of Rights Act changes Title VIII of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to allow certain grant funds to be used for the educational needs of individual children. CPAC supports school choice and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on March 24, 2023 by a vote of 113-311.

(Roll Call 161) H.R. 5 The Parents Bill of Rights Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Julia Letlow (CPAC Lifetime Rating 74%), known as the "Parents Bill of Rights Act," recognizes that parents have the primary responsibility to care for their children and are thereby entitled to know what is being taught in schools. It declares that parents have the right to review their children's school's curriculum, the right to know if the school allows males to use women's restrooms, and the right to inspect the books in the school's library. CPAC supports parental rights in education and supported this bill. The House passed H.R. 5 on March 24, 2023 by a vote of 213–208 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 173) H.R. 1 (Perry Amd.) Curtailing the EPA's Overregulation of Emissions.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Lower Energy Costs Act repeals Section 115 of the Clean Air Act. This section allows the EPA to regulate emissions that it believes are negatively impacting other countries. CPAC supports efforts to pare down the EPA's authority in this way and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on March 29, 2023 by a vote of 96-336.

(Roll Call 182) H.R. 1 The Lower Energy Costs Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Steve Scalise (CPAC Lifetime Rating 91%), known as the "Lower Energy Costs Act," promotes American energy independence by revising the Biden administration's anti-energy policies and regulations. It streamlines the permitting process for energy infrastructure, prevents President Biden from banning hydraulic fracking, disapproves of President Biden's cancellation of the Keystone XL Pipeline, and much more. CPAC supports American energy independence and supported this bill. The House passed H.R. 1 on March 30, 2023 by a vote of 225-204 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 192) H. R. 734 (Roy Amd.) Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Gregory Steube (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%), known as the "Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act," makes it unlawful for federally funded athletic programs and activities to allow males to compete in competitions designed for females. CPAC supports efforts to create a safe and fair environment of play in women's sports and supported this bill. The House passed H. R. 734 on April 20, 2023 by a vote of 219-203 but the bill died in the Senate.



(Roll Call 204) H.R. 1715 Competing with Private Services in Weather Modeling.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Max Miller (CPAC Lifetime Rating 75%), known as the "Advanced Weather Model Computing Development Act," directs the Department of Energy to research different ways to advance weather and climate modeling and prediction schemes. CPAC believes that the government should not compete with private companies in providing weather modelling services and opposed this bill. The House passed this bill on May 9, 2023 by a vote of 356-50 but the bill did not advance in the Senate.

(Roll Call 209) H.R. 2 Secure the Border Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Mario Diaz-Balart (CPAC Lifetime Rating 62%), known as the "Secure the Border Act," expands provisions barring certain people from applying for asylum, requires the DHS to resume certain planned constructions of the border wall, and requires employers to use an electronic system to verify the employment eligibility of new hires. CPAC supports efforts to enforce and strengthen federal immigration laws and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on May 11, 2023 by a vote of 219-213 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 240) H.R. 2796 Expanding Race- and Gender-based Federal Programs.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Maxine Waters (CPAC Lifetime Rating 4%), known as the "Promoting Opportunities for Non-Traditional Capital Formation Act," calls on the Office of the Advocate for Small Business Capital Formation within the SEC to host events and create educational materials to help "underrepresented" small businesses raise capital. "Underrepresented small businesses" refer primarily to women- and minority-owned businesses. CPAC opposes racism in government decision-making processes and opposed this bill. The House passed this bill on May 30, 2023 by a vote of 309-67 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 252) H.J.Res. 44 Nullifying the ATF's Absurd Shoulder Brace Rule.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Andrew Clyde (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) nullifies a rule submitted by the ATF titled, "Factoring Criteria for Firearms with Attached 'Stabilizing Braces'." This rule attempts to classify firearms with stabilizing braces as "rifles," a measure that would subject them to far stricter regulation and place millions of Americans in danger of automatically becoming felons. CPAC opposes the ATF's infringement on the Second Amendment, supports efforts to uphold Second Amendment freedoms, and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on June 13, 2023 by a vote of 219-210.



(Roll Call 253) H.J.Res. 42 Ending Washington D.C's Anti-Police, Pro-Crime Policies.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Andrew Clyde (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) nullifies Washington D.C.'s Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform Act Amendment of 2022. This legislation siphoned off funds for police operations to pay for DEI programs and placed unnecessary restrictions on law enforcement. CPAC has long worked to make our communities safer and to improve the work of the police in achieving this end. CPAC recognizes that DC's reform will have the opposite effect and, therefore, supported this resolution. CPAC, therefore, supported this bill. The House failed to override President Biden's veto of this resolution on June 13, 2023 by a vote of 233-197.

(Roll Call 255) H.R. 1615 The Gas Stove Protection and Freedom Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kelly Armstrong (CPAC Lifetime Rating 80%), known as the "Gas Stove Protection and Freedom Act," prohibits the Consumer Product Safety Commission from using federal funds to ban gas stoves or create a regulation that makes gas stoves prohibitively expensive. CPAC supports consumer choice and opposes bureaucratic meddling and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on June 13, 2023 by a vote of 248-180 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 262) H.R. 277 (Roy Amd.) Extending Congressional Oversight Over Bureaucratic Rules Promoting Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

The Rep. Chip Roy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) amendment to the REINS Act of 2023 expands the provisions within the REINS Act to give Congress the authority to approve major rules related to DEI. CPAC opposes racist DEI programs, supports efforts to increase legislative oversight over the bureaucracy, and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on June 14, 2023 by a vote of 217–219.

(Roll Call 265) H.R. 277 The REINS Act of 2023.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kat Cammack (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%), known as the "Regulations from the Executive in Need of Scrutiny Act," creates a congressional approval process for major rules proposed by executive agencies and prevents these agencies from implementing such rules until they are approved by Congress. The definition of "major rule" includes those that will have an effect on the economy of \$100,000,000 or more, those that will substantially change prices for consumers, those that will badly damage US business interests, or those that will greatly increase vaccination rates. CPAC supports measures that increase legislative oversight over bureaucratic rules and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on June 14, 2023 by a vote of 221-210 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 271) H. R. 288 Separation of Powers Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Scott Fitzgerald (CPAC Lifetime Rating 87%), known as the "Separation of Powers Act," allows courts to no longer give federal bureaucrats the benefit of the doubt when Americans take executive agencies to court. CPAC supports efforts to reign in bureaucratic overreach and strengthen the separation of powers within the federal government. CPAC, therefore, supported this bill. The House passed H. R. 288 on June 15, 2023 by a vote of 220–211 but the bill died in the Senate.



(Roll Call 277) H.J.Res. 45 Cracking Down On Unconstitutional Executive Student Loan Actions.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Rep. Bob Good (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) nullifies a rule promulgated by the Department of Education titled, "One Time Federal Student Loan Debt Relief." This rule forgave \$10,000 of student debt. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay off other people's debts, believes that this action was clearly unconstitutional, and supported this resolution. The House failed to override President Biden's veto of this resolution by a vote of 221-206 (a 2/3 vote was necessary for the bill to pass) but the rule was later found unconstitutional by the Supreme Court.

(Roll Call 282) H.R. 3799 The CHOICE Arrangement Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kevin Hern (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%), known as the "CHOICE Arrangement Act," expands healthcare insurance options for small businesses and their employees. It gives small businesses the option to pay their workers in cash which workers may then use to purchase the healthcare coverage of their choice. CPAC supports measures that promote freedom in healthcare decisions and supported this bill. The House passed H. R. 3799 on June 21, 2023 by a vote of 220-209 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 283) H.Res. 521 Censuring Adam Schiff For His Grotesque Lies to the American People.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Anna Paulina Luna (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) censures Adam Schiff for lying to the American people about President Trump's relationship with Russia. Beginning in 2016, Representative Schiff repeatedly alleged that he had significant evidence that President Trump colluded with Russia to win the 2016 election. However, a special counsel created to investigate this matter found that these allegations were outright lies. CPAC opposes Representative Schiff's abuse of his office and supported this resolution. The House passed H. Res. 521 on June 21, 2023 by a vote of 213-209.

(Roll Call 300) H.R. 2670 (Jackson Amd.) Amendment Prohibiting the Department of Defense from Paying for Abortions.

The Rep. Ronny Jackson (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 prohibits the Secretary of Defense from using public funds to pay for abortions. CPAC believes that funds appropriated for defense purposes should be used for defense purposes, not abortions, and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 221-213.

(Roll Call 301) H. R. 2670 (Rosendale Amd.) Amendment Prohibiting the Department of Defense from Paying for Radical Gender Surgeries.

The Rep. Matthew Rosendale (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 prohibits the military's healthcare system from covering gender reassignment surgeries or hormone replacement therapies. The amendment also prohibits the Department of Defense from paying for gender reassignment surgeries. CPAC believes that public funds should not be used to fund elective surgeries and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 222-211.



(Roll Call 306) H.R. 2670 (Davidson Amd.) Requiring the POTUS to Create a Plan of Action for the US in Ukraine.

The Rep. Warren Davidson (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 requires the President to submit a report to Congress containing a strategy for US involvement in the ongoing war in Ukraine. CPAC believes that the US needs this type of plan of action and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 129-301.

(Roll Call 310) H.R. 2670 (Crane Amd.) Ending DEI Hiring and Promotion Practices at the Department of Defense.

The Rep. Elijah Crane (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 prohibits the Department of Defense from conditioning its hiring, promotion, or retention of individuals based on their participation in or affirmation of certain "race-based concepts." These concepts include those that teach that a person is inherently racist or that people should feel shame because of their race. CPAC believes that the Department of Defense should focus on defending the US, not promoting the Left's racial ideologies, and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 214-210.

(Roll Call 313) H.R. 2670 (Norman Amd.) Requiring Patriotic Flags to Be Flown at Federal Facilities.

The Rep. Ralph Norman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the NDAA for FY 2024 states that only the American flag, state flags, military service flags, and a selection of other flags may be flown at federal facilities. CPAC supports efforts to promote patriotism in the federal government and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 218-213.

(Roll Call 318) H.R. 2670 (Hageman Amd.) Scrutinizing the Countering Extremism Working Group

The Rep. Harriet Hageman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the NDAA of FY 2024 requires that the documents and correspondence of the Countering Extremism Working Group be made available to the Select Subcommittee on the Weaponization of the Federal Government and the Committee on Armed Services. This group is tasked with combating ideologies that the government deems "extreme" among the ranks of the US military. CPAC recognizes that this group is a weapon deployed by the government to attack conservative members of the military, believes that it is deserving of thorough scrutiny, and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on July 13, 2023 by a vote of 218-213.

(Roll Call 358) H.R. 3935 (Perry Amd.) Wasting Money on Green R&D Programs for Plane Engines.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Securing Growth and Robust Leadership in American Aviation Act cuts out the Continuous Lower Energy, Emissions, and Noise Program (CLEEN). Under this program, the FAA partners with airline companies to develop greener and more efficient engines by contributing funds to airline research and development projects. CPAC believes that the government should refrain from subsidizing favored industries with taxpayer dollars and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on July 19, 2023 by a vote of 127-308.



(Roll Call 371) H.R. 4366 (Greene Amd.) Cutting an Increase in Funding for the NATO Security Investment Program.

The Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2024 cuts the \$73,000,000 funding increase for the NATO Security Investment Program. CPAC believes that President Donald Trump's strategy of conditioning increases in funding for NATO on the choice of other countries to contribute their fair share to its budget is the best strategy for dealing with the organization. CPAC, therefore, supported this amendment as a way of driving nations to contribute more to NATO's security infrastructure. The House defeated this amendment on July 26, 2023 by a vote of 83-347.

(Roll Call 381) S.J.Res. 9 Cracking Down on the Government's Abuse of the Endangered Species List.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. Roger Marshall (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%) nullifies a rule created by the US Fish and Wildlife Service titled, "Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants; Lesser Prairie-Chicken; Threatened Status with Section 4(d) Rule for the Northern Distinct Population Segment and Endangered Status for the Southern Distinct Population Status." The rule places the Lesser Prairie-Chicken on the endangered species list and extends various protections to it. CPAC recognizes that the endangered species list has been used by Left-wing environmental radicals to stop economic development. In the case of the Lesser Prairie-Chicken, its "endangerment" has helped bolster opposition to the Keystone XL pipeline, a project particularly hated by the environmental Left. CPAC opposes the abuse of the endangered species list in this way and supported this resolution. The House passed S. J. Res. 9 resolution on July 27, 2023 by a vote of 221-206 but President Biden vetoed the resolution.

(Roll Call 391) H.R. 1435 Protecting Consumers Against Radical Bans on Gas-Powered Cars.

This bill sponsored by Rep. John Joyce (CPAC Lifetime Rating 87%), known as the "Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act," prohibits the EPA from authorizing a state to adopt a regulation prohibiting or limiting the sale of a new type of motor vehicle if the regulation is being set because of the vehicles use of an internal combustion engine. The bill also requires the EPA to revoke authorizations issued after January 1, 2022 that allowed for states to enact such regulations. CPAC supports efforts to preserve consumer choice in the motor vehicle market and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on September 14, 2023 by a vote of 222-190 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 412) H.R. 4368 (Brecheen Amd.) Stripping Appropriations for the USDA's Rental Assistance Program.

The Rep. Josh Brecheen (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Act for FY 2024 eliminates funding for the USDA's rental assistance program. This program provides payments to USDA-financed rural and farm labor housing project owners to support low-income tenants. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay for other people's rent and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 27, 2023 by a vote of 89-341.



(Roll Call 429) H.R. 4368 (Miller Amd.) Striking Out Funding for the Left's "Climate Corps."

The Rep. Mary Miller (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies Act for FY 2024 prohibits the funds appropriated in the bill from being used to implement the Climate Corps. The Climate Corps is a government program that seeks to combat climate change by training young people in career paths that will supposedly help facilitate the US' transition to a greener and more efficient future. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay for the indoctrination of young people into the Left's extremist climate agenda and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on September 27, 2023 by a vote of 217-216.

(Roll Call 465) H.R. 4665 (Perry Amd.) Eliminating Funds for USAID.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 cuts all funding to the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). USAID has, for years, been rife with inefficiency and fraud and is duplicative of other federal bureaucracies. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to continue funding this poorly managed branch of the bureaucracy and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 111-315.

(Roll Call 469) H.R. 4665 (Perry Amd.) Redirecting Government Resources Away from Illegal Immigration Assistance Programs.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 eliminates funding for the government's refugee and migration assistance programs. CPAC believes that these resources should instead be directed toward the well-being of American citizens and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 121-311.

(Roll Call 473) H.R. 4665 (Greene Amd.) Cut in Additional Funding to Ukraine.

The Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the federal government from using funds appropriated in the act to send aid to Ukraine. CPAC recognizes that American taxpayers have already spent over \$75 billion dollars in Ukraine, a third of which has gone toward non-military expenditures. CPAC believes that President Donald Trump's tactic of conditioning increases in funding for the US' European allies on the choice of other countries to contribute their fair share to the cause at hand is an acceptable strategy moving forward and supports this amendment as a means of pushing NATO members to contribute more to Ukraine's cause. Additionally, 82% of the respondents to CPAC's 2024 straw poll disapproved of measures that provide an even greater amount of funds to Ukraine. CPAC thus believes that funding for the war in Ukraine should be more properly scrutinized outside of massive omnibus bills and supported this amendment as a means of encouraging this outcome. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 90-342.



(Roll Call 483) H.R. 4665 (Gooden Amd.) Cutting the Purse Strings of NGOs that Facilitate Illegal Immigration.

The Rep. Lance Gooden (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the government from using funds appropriated in the bill to support the International Organization for Migration's "Refugee Travel Loan Program." This NGO, alongside many other NGOs, pays to send people to the United States. CPAC believes that taxpayer funds should not be used to fund the US' migration crisis and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 198-232.

(Roll Call 484) H.R. 4665 (Spartz Amd.) Increasing Congressional Authority to Oversee Funds Sent to the UN.

The Rep. Victoria Spartz (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the government from funding entities within the United Nations unless Congress specifically appropriates funds to those entities. CPAC recognizes that the UN does not represent the interests of the American taxpayer and that its organizations have been co-opted by anti-American sentiments. CPAC therefore supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 188-242.

(Roll Call 486) H.R. 4665 (Foxx Amd.) Stopping Federal Participation in the Clinton Global Initiative.

The Rep. Virginia Foxx (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the State Department from using its resources to send federal employees to Clinton Global Initiative (CGI) events. Founded by Hillary and Bill Clinton, the CGI has supported numerous prominent Leftist causes. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay to let public employees attend CGI conferences and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 218-215.

(Roll Call 495) H.R. 4665 (Perry Amd.) Slashing All Appropriations for the UNRWA.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Department of State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the government from funding the United Nations Relief and Works Agency. The UNRWA is a welfare organization that is specifically designed to assist Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank. UNRWA schools have, for years, been a major source of antisemitism and anti-American indoctrination for the Palestinian population. CPAC believes that the federal government should not fund the work of antisemites and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on September 28, 2023 by a vote of 213–218, just a little over a week before the October 7 terrorist attacks against Israel.



(Roll Call 513) H.R. 5860 Temporarily Extending Pelosi's Unsustainable Spending Policies.

This continuing resolution sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Continuing Appropriations Act, 2024 and Other Extensions Act," allowed the government to continue spending money at its then-current levels for 45 days. CPAC opposes these extensions and the preservation of irresponsible spending policies and opposed this bill. The House passed this bill on September 30, 2023 by a vote of 335-91 and the bill later became law.

(Roll Call 521) Election of the Speaker Vote to Elect Jim Jordan as Speaker of the House of Representatives.

This roll call vote was taken in an attempt to elect Representative Jim Jordan (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) as the Speaker of the House of Representatives after Kevin McCarthy was ousted from his position. CPAC acknowledges that Representative Jordan has the highest CPAC rating of all time and supported his bid to become Speaker. The House failed to elect Representative Jordan on October 17, 2023 after he received only 200 votes.

(Roll Call 534) H.R. 4394 (Perry Amd.) Ending Subsidies to Federally-Backed Clean Energy Demonstrations.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment reduces funding for the Office of Clean Energy Demonstrations within the Department of Energy, a new section of the bureaucracy created by the Biden administration to push the Left's climate change scams. CPAC supports all forms of energy, believes that the government should not support one form of energy over another, and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on October 26, 2023 by a vote of 135-284.

(Roll Call 546) H.R. 4394 (Hageman Amd.) Cutting Wasted Funds Used to Pay for Green Heavy-Duty Vehicles.

The Rep. Harriet Hageman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the funding of the Supertruck III program. This program helps fund the creation of low emissions medium- and heavy-duty truck and freight systems. CPAC opposes the endless funding of R&D projects that should instead be initiated by the private sector and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on October 26, 2023 by a vote of 176-241.

(Roll Call 555) H.R. 4394 (Rosendale Amd.) Reducing Funding for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to 2022 Levels.

The Rep. Matthew Rosendale (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 reduces funding for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to 2022 levels. This amendment represents a long list of multiple amendments that also attempt to reduce overall government spending. CPAC supports efforts to reduce the size and scope of the government and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on October 26, 2023 by a vote of 76-335.



(Roll Call 567) H.R. 4821 (Hageman Amd.) Cutting 50% of the Appropriations for the Bureau of Land Management.

The Rep. Harriet Hageman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 reduces the amount of funds appropriated to the Bureau of Land Management by 50%. The BLM is primarily in charge of acquiring, regulating, and maintaining federal lands. CPAC supports efforts to reduce funding for this bureaucracy and supported this bill. The House defeated this amendment on November 2, 2023 by a vote of 144-280.

(Roll Call 571) H.R. 4821 (Perry Amd.) Ending Subsidies to Leftist Pet Projects.

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 strikes funding in the bill for the National Endowment for the Humanities. The Endowment is a federal agency that provides grants to various Leftist causes. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to fund non-essential pet projects while American families struggle with the effects of Bidenomics and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 2, 2023 by a vote of 132-292.

(Roll Call 577) H.R. 6126 Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act," appropriates funds to Israel for its Iron Dome system and other defense measures. It then offsets the cost of this appropriation by reducing funds that were eventually to be appropriated to the Internal Revenue Service. CPAC supports Israel's right to defend itself, supports the lowering of funds appropriated to the IRS, and supported this bill. The House passed this bill on November 2, 2023 by a vote of 226-196 but the bill died in the Senate.

(Roll Call 594) H.R. 4821 (Roy Amd.) Withholding Funds from Left-Wing Environmental Justice Causes.

The Rep. Chip Roy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 98%) amendment to the Department of the Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the federal government from using funds to carry out "environmental justice activities." Environmental justice is a strand of intersectionality that seeks to combine the strictures of the Left's radical climate agenda with the discrimination of its racial agenda. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay for either agenda and supported this amendment. The House passed this amendment on November 3, 2023 by a vote of 212-204.



(Roll Call 607) H.R. 4820 (Brecheen Amd.) Reducing the Government's Power Over Property Owners.

The Rep. Josh Brecheen (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 reduces appropriations to the Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity to pre-COVID levels. CPAC recognizes that this office was significantly expanded beyond its original size in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, supports efforts to shrink it back to pre-pandemic levels, and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 7, 2023 by a vote of 174-252.

(Roll Call 611) H.R. 4820 (Grothman Amd.) Dragging the Government Out of Community Development and Housing Initiatives.

The Rep. Glenn Grothman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 92%) amendment to the Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 decreases funding for the Community Development Fund. This fund apportions grants to local governments such that they may provide housing to low-income people. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to pay for other people's housing and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 7, 2023 by a vote of 106-324.

(Roll Call 619) H.R. 4820 (Norman Amd.) Impeding the Growth of Radical Gender Policies.

The Rep. Ralph Norman (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the federal government from funding the rule, "Equal Access in Accordance with an Individual's Gender Identity in Community Planning and Development Programs." This rule allows transgender individuals to access the services of single-sex HUD projects if they identify as members of the sex to which the project is assigned. CPAC opposes radical gender ideology and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 7, 2023 by a vote of 212-217.

(Roll Call 622) H.Res. 845 Censuring Rashida Tlaib for Spreading Antisemitism and Invading the Cannon Rotunda.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Marjorie Taylor Greene (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) censures Representative Rashida Tlaib for her antisemitic remarks, her sympathy for terrorist organizations, and her leadership of an unlawful demonstration at the US Capitol Complex. Following the October 7 attacks on Israel, Representative Tlaib made numerous incorrect and misleading statements about the ongoing conflict. For example, she helped foster the lie that Israel had launched a rocket at the Al-Ahli Arab Hospital and killed hundreds of people. This was false. Representative Tlaib would later go on to help lead a protest inside the Cannon Rotunda in the US Capitol Complex. CPAC opposes Representative Tlaib's antisemitism, further opposes her storming of the Capitol complex, and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on November 7, 2023 by a vote of 234-188.



(Roll Call 625) H.R. 4664 (Harshbarger Amd.) Amendment to Disarm the IRS by Cutting their Firearms Budget.

The Rep. Diana Harshbarger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 95%) amendment to the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act for FY 2024 eliminates funding for firearms and ammunition for the IRS. CPAC believes that the IRS should not be armed with weapons and supported this amendment. The House defeated this bill on November 8, 2023 by a vote of 187-238.

(Roll Call 635) H.R. 4664 (Harshbarger Amd.) Checking the White House's Gender Initiatives

The Rep. Diana Harshbarger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 95%) amendment to the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the bill from funding the White House Gender Policy Council. This council was created by the Biden administration to advance gender discrimination in the name of "equity" in domestic and foreign policy. CPAC opposes discrimination based on race and gender no matter how well-intentioned and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 8, 2023 by a vote of 205-211.

(Roll Call 637) H.R. 4664 (Ogles Amd.) Paycheck Protection Provisions for Federal Employees.

The Rep. Andrew Ogles (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the funding of the Federal Labor Relations Authority's rule titled, "Miscellaneous and General Requirements." The rule hampers the ability of federal employees to opt out of labor union participation. CPAC supports efforts to give federal employees the ability to choose whether they wish to participate in a labor union or not and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 8, 2023 by a vote of 196-223.

(Roll Call 639) H.R. 4664 (Rosendale Amd.) Defunding Biden's Gun Control Agenda.

The Rep. Matthew Rosendale (CPAC Lifetime Rating 100%) amendment to the Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Act for FY 2024 prohibits the federal government from funding the Office of Gun Violence Prevention. This office was created by the Biden administration and is overseen by Vice President Kamala Harris. It works to expand and promote the administration's various gun control measures. CPAC supports the Second Amendment as it was envisioned by the founders and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 8, 2023 by a vote of 208-212.



(Roll Call 648) H.R. 5894 (Miller Amd.) Working to Reduce Regulatory Burdens on Employers Nationwide.

The Rep. Mary Miller (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 completely defunds the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) While OSHA may have provided value when it was first created, it now wages bureaucratic war on employers. CPAC believes that regulations on businesses of the nature that OSHA promulgates should instead be imposed at the state level and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 14, 2023 by a vote of 131-300.

(Roll Call 655) H.R. 5894 (Biggs Amd.) Reducing Taxpayer Subsidization of Leftist Indoctrination at Universities.

The Rep. Andy Biggs (CPAC Lifetime Rating 97%) amendment to the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 slashes the entirety of the federal government's apportionment of \$1,769,207,000 to the Student Aid Administration. This organization dumps loans and grants onto young students such that they can pay the exorbitant costs of a Leftist education at a university or college. CPAC believes that taxpayers should not be forced to help pay the costs of other people's higher education and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 14, 2023 by a vote of 81-353.

(Roll Call 658) H.R. 6363 Further Extending Pelosi's Unsustainable Spending Policies.

This bill sponsored by Rep. Kay Granger (CPAC Lifetime Rating 81%), known as the "Further Continuing Appropriations and Other Extensions Act, 2024," allowed the government to continue spending money at its then-current levels for 45 days. CPAC opposes these extensions and the preservation of irresponsible spending policies and opposed this bill. The House passed this bill on November 14, 2023 by a vote of 336-95 and the bill later became law.

(Roll Call 661) H.R. 5894 (Perry Amd.) Facing Off Against the Corrupt Bargain Between the Government and Labor Unions

The Rep. Scott Perry (CPAC Lifetime Rating 96%) amendment to the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act for FY 2024 reduces funding for the National Labor Relations Board by 50%. The NLRB has, historically, been an activist, pro-union agency and has transformed the government into an ATM for Left-wing labor bosses. CPAC supports the defunding of the corrupt bargain between unions and the government and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on November 15, 2023 by a vote of 169-257.



(Roll Call 690) S.J.Res. 32 Cracking Down on Leftist Weapons Against Meritocracy and Business.

This Congressional Review Act resolution sponsored by Sen. John Kennedy (CPAC Lifetime Rating 82%) nullifies a rule created by the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau titled, "Small Business Lending Under the Equal Credit Opportunity Act (Regulation B)." The rule makes it easier for the CFPB to receive information on the demographics of businesses that submit applications for credit to covered financial institutions. CPAC opposes the use of race and gender to advance the Left-wing equity agenda and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on December 1, 2023 by a vote of 221-202.

(Roll Call 691) H.Res. 878 Inappropriately Reducing the Republican Majority in the House.

This resolution sponsored by Rep. Michael Guest (CPAC Lifetime Rating 86%) expels Representative George Santos (CPAC Lifetime Rating 91%) from the House of Representatives. CPAC recognizes that expulsions of this nature have historically occurred after a Congress person has been convicted of a serious crime. CPAC recognizes that Representative Santos is innocent until proven guilty and opposed his expulsion at the time from the House. The House passed this resolution on December 1, 2023 by a vote of 311-114.

(Roll Call 699) H.R. 5933 (Ogles Amd.) Exposing Corruption at America's Top Universities.

The Rep. Andrew Ogles (CPAC Lifetime Rating 99%) amendment to the DETERRENT Act requires universities to report all gifts and donations made to them by authoritarian regimes in foreign countries of concern. CPAC supports efforts to make universities more transparent about their sources of funding and supported this amendment. The House defeated this amendment on December 6, 2023 by a vote of 94–320.

(Roll Call 720) H.R. 918 Taking Steps to Impeach President Joseph R. Biden for High Crimes and Misdemeanors.


This resolution sponsored by Rep. Kelly Armstrong (CPAC Lifetime Rating 80%) authorizes the House Committees on Oversight and Accountability, Ways and Means, and the Judiciary to continue to investigate whether there exists sufficient evidence with which to impeach President Biden. CPAC believes that President Biden's dealings with his son Hunter Biden merit investigation and supported this resolution. The House passed this resolution on December 13, 2023 by a vote of 221-212.

(Roll Call 723) H.R. 2670 National Defense Authorization Act.

The NDAA for FY 2024 sponsored by Rep. Mike Rogers (CPAC Lifetime Rating 78%) is a gargantuan 3000+ page piece of legislation that advances various Leftist causes under the guise of national security. Firstly, it extends Section 702 of the FISA Act, the likes of which allows the government to spy on Americans. Additionally, the bill continues to allow the government to fund travel for abortion purposes. CPAC believes that the government should instead work to curb the police powers that have been frequently abused by the government, opposes publicly funding abortion travel, and opposed the passage of this bill. The House passed this bill on December 14, 2023 by a vote of 310-118.



HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE



When "Conservative Democrat" Was Not an Oxymoron

In recent years, one's party affiliation has become the key indicator as to whether a legislator is conservative or liberal. In the House of Representatives, Republicans scored an average of 81% while Democrats scored only 2%. The situation was hardly different in the Senate. Republicans averaged 79% and Democrats averaged only 2%. These results are peculiar because they point to, with the added context of CPAC's decades of Congressional research, major shifts in both parties with the Democrats leaning especially to the Left.

Consider the ratings of Maryland's representatives from CPAC's first edition of the congressional ratings in 1971. If you were to be told that one member of congress from Maryland posted a 75 rating while another achieved a "0," you would assume the Republican received a higher number. But the opposite was true. Montgomery County Republican Gil Gude is attached to the "0" rating while Democrat Goodloe Byron, representing conservative western Maryland for many years, achieved the 75. Similar results could be found around that time in the Senate. In 1972, two Republican Senate veterans, Jake Javits of New York and Clifford Case of New Jersey, each earned a "0" while Democrats John Sparkman of Alabama and John Stennis of Mississippi achieved perfect 100 scores. Nowadays, it's rare to find a Democrat that breaks into the teens. Republicans, while less uniform in their conservatism, typically don't fall below 30%. Clearly, the parties have polarized into opposite ends of the political spectrum.

When did this change come about? While the reasons for this shift are manifold, one of the main catalysts for this phenomenon occurred when conservative Democrats started losing their party's primaries in the '70s and '80s. Take Congressman Kent Hance of Texas, the man who had defeated George H.W. Bush to win his House seat, as a prime example of this. In 1984, he lost the primary for a Senate seat to Austin liberal Lloyd Doggett by 509 votes out of 1 million cast, a shock that convinced conservative Democrats in Texas they could no longer win their party's primaries. After this upset, many threw in their hat and became a Republican. This trend of purging conservative Democrats has been replicated time and again in the decades since, with the most instance of this occurring in Arizona with the complete rejection by Democrats of Kyrsten Sinema. Whether this phenomenon is best, I will leave for the country to decide.



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
